

## Gary can:

- Participate in a co-op placement through his high school and learn more about jobs he may be interested in.
- Explore volunteer opportunities that will allow him to gain better knowledge of different jobs and businesses.
- Evaluate self-employment as an option and explore funding opportunities available to students starting a summer business.
- Examine job descriptions and skill requirements for different occupations to ensure he aligns his interests and education accordingly.
- Research and meet with potential employers and perhaps set up an informational interview to learn about jobs they offer and future hiring needs.
- Attend public forums that allow him to speak to people currently working in jobs he is interested in.
- Continue life-long learning to make himself more marketable to a wide range of employers.
- Research the local labour market. Understand where the future job opportunities will be so that he can make informed decisions about future education and training.
- Educate himself about jobs and salaries, occupations that are growing/disappearing, qualifications employers are looking for, companies that are growing and expanding.
- Explore all programs and services offered in his community.
